Teen Read participation is **MANDATORY** for any volunteer going into 6th through 12th grades!

Going into 7th-12th Student volunteers going into 7th-12th grade will get to help out during summer reading.

Going into 6th Student volunteers going into 6th grade will be eligible to volunteer beginning in August.

All Student volunteers must read and report on at least 5 books to be eligible for volunteer hours beginning in August.

Student volunteers who do not complete the 5 book requirement will not be eligible for volunteer hours, and any hours completed during the summer will be forfeited.

Teen Read participants going into 7th grade and up are eligible to volunteer at the Library during summer reading! You'll get to help us with:

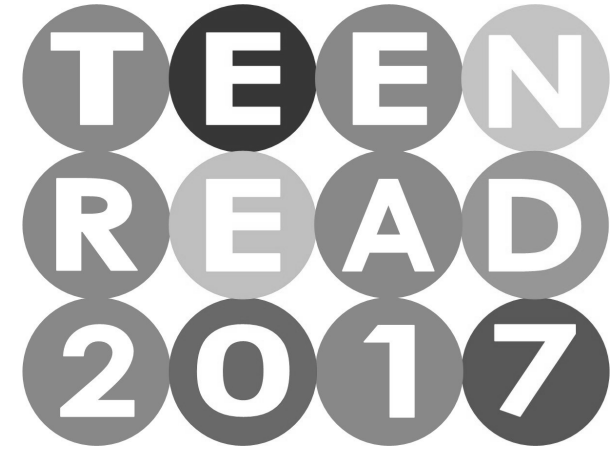
