

A Reader-Friendly Library



Traditional library spaces are organized around materials; not necessarily the needs of the readers using the materials. Our new nonfiction room design will soon put you, the reader, first!

Smaller themed collections of nonfiction titles will draw people in and create spaces more conducive to exploration and creative learning. Grouped around themes such as Parenting, Create It, DIY Home, Cooking, Parenting, or Healthy Living, neighborhoods will hold materials from multiple Dewey sections, collecting in one area materials readers might reasonably expect to find together.

This project was funded through a generous grant from the Friends of the Library and the Library Endowment Fund, and approved by the Township commissioners as part of the Township's 2017 capital improvement plan.

Library Endowment Fund

You are contributing to the endowment fund every time you drop some change into the donation boxes at the main desks, or send a check as an annual gift.

Also, please consider planned giving through gifts of stocks or bonds, wills and trusts, life insurance and life income plans. For individuals 70 1/2 years of age or older, it is possible to make tax-favored gifts known as Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) from traditional and Roth IRA accounts directly to the library. Amounts given in this manner count toward required IRA minimum withdrawal amounts for the year of the gift and can result in lower IRA income; thus, lower adjusted gross income on your tax return.
