Create a Share a Skill Video
5 hours of community service

Utilizing your talents, create, produce and share a skill video for your peers. This video would be shared on the Teen Library website, so your parent/guardian will have to sign a waiver to allow you to do this opportunity. You can share a simple skill like hair braiding, a unique skill like unicycling, or a complicated skill like folding origami. Be creative!
