United Senior Citizens

The United Senior Citizens Program is sponsored by the Upper St. Clair Department of Recreation and Leisure Services. The Township Recreation Center is open each Wednesday from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. for the senior citizens' lunch, activities, and programs.

Morning activities are informal and include lunch preparation by volunteers from the group. The members hold a brief business meeting at 12:30 p.m., which is followed by the meal. The afternoon's activities include musical entertainment, lectures or presentations of interest, book reviews, health and fitness instruction, game days, and arts and crafts. Members also enjoy playing cards, shooting pool, playing golf (weather permitting), and occasional games of bingo, shuffleboard, or ping-pong. In addition to the Recreation Center activities, day trips to various performances and places of interest are scheduled throughout the year.

Eligibility: Individuals must be residents of Upper St. Clair, 55 years of age or older, and retired. Spouses of eligible members may also become members even if under age 55.

Silver Card Program

The Recreation and Leisure Services Department offers the **Silver Card Program** for Senior Citizens in Upper St. Clair. Holders of this card are entitled to free admittance to the **Municipal three-hole golf course and outdoor tennis** facilities.

Any resident age 62 and retired or age 65 with no restrictions is eligible for the Silver Card Program. Applications are available at the Recreation Department. Stop in and ask for your Silver Card. Proof of age is required at the time of application.

ACCESS And Port Authority Senior Citizen Program

Applications for the Port Authority Senior Citizen program and ACCESS transportation are available at the Department of Recreation and Leisure Services. Application must be made in person at the Recreation Office during business hours Monday through Friday. Proof of age is required at the time of application.

Silver Scholars Computer Classes

Silver Scholars teaches computer classes specifically designed for individuals over the age of 50, but all are invited. The classes are fun, interactive, begin with the basics and will help you become a computer wiz! Classes will be held at listed locations. To enhance learning, all classes are limited to 10 students, so register early.

Basic Computers 1 & 2

No previous computer knowledge is required.

Basic Computers will provide hands-on experience using Windows. The first class will explain how to turn a computer on and off, the basic functions of the mouse, how to open programs, search menus, and more. The second class will provide time for review and progress to understanding the keyboard. Learn how to input information into the computer, correct typing errors, insert and delete text, and more.

The Internet 1 & 2

Prerequisite: Basic Computers or equivalent knowledge

Searching the Internet will provide hands-on experience. The first class will explain the basics of search engines and browsers. You will learn how to connect to the Internet and how to navigate your way around the World Wide Web. The second class will provide time for review and practice. The second class will discuss browsers in more detail, show you how to download programs, search more effectively, store favorites, and avoid viruses. You will also learn how to access Web sites more efficiently.
